



Research Guide to SmartCILP™

WHAT IS IT?

SmartCILP is an electronic periodical awareness tool that provides automated, personalized e-mail delivery of Current Index to Legal Periodicals (CILP). Our library subscribes to the SmartCILP service in addition to a regular subscription to CILP from the University of Washington Law Library. Once a profile is set up, you will receive an e-mail message each week that focuses only on the subjects and journals you selected. The profile can be changed as your research needs change.

HOW DO I ACCESS SmartCILP?

- SmartCILP is available at <http://lib.law.washington.edu/cilp/scilp.html>. Our site license allows faculty to establish their own customized subscription service to receive email updates. These e-mails allow faculty to stay on top of recent law review and law journals publications.
- To subscribe click on the “Create or Change a SmartCILP profile” link and enter an authorization code.
- The **authorization code is available from the reference staff** (please call extension 6284).
- Once the authorization code and personal details have been entered the user can either select which journals’ content they wish to subscribe to from a list of journals, or select journal contents based on subject or topic.

A sample entry from SmartCILP, which includes article availability on Lexis and Westlaw, looks like this:
