



DuFour Law Library Privacy Policy

The protection of your privacy while using the Judge Kathryn J. DuFour Law Library is an essential element of your intellectual and academic freedom. Education records are protected by the Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the [CUA Student Record Policy](#) as well as the [CUA Information Assurance Policy](#). In addition, it is the policy of the Law Library that the privacy of all users will be respected.

The Law Library treats all records as confidential and under most circumstances will not reveal personally identifiable information of individual users or reveal what information sources or services users consult. However, the Law Library may be obligated to release such information to law enforcement agents in response to a search warrant, subpoena, or other lawful directive. Under certain circumstances, staff may be prohibited from informing you that the Law Library received such a request.

The Law Library may release information to The Catholic University of America's Department of Public Safety in connection with alleged violations of law, or when a violation of University, campus, or Law Library policies has taken place; or when failure to act might result in significant bodily harm or significant property loss.
